

#### AND NOW A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR...

October is a month around here that brings a bit of rest. Our bazaars are over and their success celebrated. Yet there are always activities and meetings. CCE is in full swing on Wednesday evenings. Bible Study gathers and studies the Psalms on Thursdays. The Senior Group (Guardian Angels) is back to throwing down dominos on Tuesdays. St. Mary's Men's Club and our Altar Societies continue to meet and work steadily behind the scene for the good of our churches. Our hospitality teams for Sunday Fellowship are busy cooking/ baking to delight everyone's palate.

Did I say 'rest'?

Whatever time of year, visitors marvel at all the activity that goes on around here. Their surprise begins with the energy and enthusiasm they experience when attending our Sunday celebration. I hear so often from visitors that they feel a real sense of prayer and participation in our Masses that they don't experience in their own parishes. It's especially evident, they say, in the joy they see in our faces as we celebrate the Sacred Liturgy. It's not a chore or obligation. One comment I distinctly remember is that "these people like each other". That spirit of liking each other overflows into our worship together and our working together throughout the year...and years.

Things do begin to cool off during October. As I'm writing this the last days of September, a cool front has come in. We're all looking forward to a mild, cool Autumn. I'm praying that we don't have a winter like we had last year. Regardless of the weather or the time of year, we will all just continue being who we are: The Body of Christ in this tiny corner of Texas worshipping, praying, playing and working together.

October has traditionally been dedicated as the Month of the Rosary. Growing up, as difficult as it was to squeeze it in, Mom tried her best to kneel us down to say the Rosary before going to bed during the month of October. Didn't happen every night but often enough to put calluses on our knees...lol. I didn't really appreciate it at the time but that rosary together made October a special month. We kids would moan and groan under our breath, but got into it eventually....after a cold stare from Mother...yep. I would recommend it to you and your family. We normally experience the rosary as a religious exercise that is usually done individually. However, when prayed in the context of the family, it takes on a special means of bringing the family together.

As we gather as a family for our Sunday celebrations during October, I would like the Rosary to be prayed before we start Mass. If you're interested in leading the Rosary before Mass during October, I'll have a sign-up sheet at the entrance to each church. I ask that the Rosary start 20 minutes before Mass. I'll also have a guideline on how to pray it publicly.
