

# The true meaning of the "12 Days of Christmas"

All right, I put it to ya. What guy would ever give his girl hens, geese, and maids-a-milking? Maybe one that knows the secret meaning behind these age-old words.

#### THE 12 DAYS OF CHRISTMAS:

12 days that the Church celebrates the feast of Christ's birth...December 25<sup>th</sup> to January 6<sup>th</sup> Epiphany

My True Love: Christ Himself-born on Christmas Day to "give gifts" (Ephesians 4-8) to mankind. A Partridge in a Pear Tree: The partridge symbolized Christ. The pear tree reminds us of the fruit tree in Paradise that brought death to mankind...as well as the Tree of the Cross that gives eternal life. This is the most important gift Christ gave us...which is why this line is repeated.

**Two Turtledoves:** The Old and New Testaments, both inspired by the Holy Spirit (the Dove...kinda neat huh?).

Three French Hens: The three great virtues: Faith, Hope and Love, that St. Paul speaks of in 1 Corinthians 13:13.

<u>Four Calling Birds</u>: The Four Gospels. Like birds crying out they proclaim the coming of Christ and His saving work.

<u>Five Golden Rings</u>: The first five books of the Old Testament (Pentateuch) which set forth the laws of God. The Bible say the Laws of God are more precious than gold (Psalm 19:10-11) and shall not pass away. The round ring represents eternity.

<u>Six Geese A-Laying</u>: The six days of Creation (Genesis 1) it's fall and rebirth. Eggs symbolize the rebirth.

<u>Seven Swans A-Swimming</u>: The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit that make the follower of Christ noble... swans symbolize nobility.

<u>Eight Maids A-Milking</u>: The eight Beatitudes which illustrate the Christian way of life. In the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:3-10) Christ especially praises those who are lowly and humble...like serving girls who milk cows.

<u>Nine Ladies Dancing</u>: The nine fruits of the Holy Spirit listed in Galatians 5:22..love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. These gifts make the Christian life a joyful experience...like dancing.



#### 2022 St. Mary's Men's Club Scholarship


Applications are now available in the parish office (see Karen Molina).
