The big news circulating around here for a few weeks now has been the announcement of the Cedar's estate being developed into residential homesites. The Cedar's is the large track of land with its entrance just as you turn off Hwy 105 onto FM 1774 to your right.

A Mr. Isec (sic) Baker coming to Texas from Alabama bought a large tract of land near the town site of Plantersville and erected a rather large plantation home on the property in 1854. In historical documents it is known as 'Cedar Hall' or 'The Cedar's'.

The plantation home is still standing, though said to be in need of attention. The plantation grew cotton, of course, as its main source of income, harvested by the slaves Mr. Baker brought with him from Alabama. On the property is the cemetery of the Bakers and other owners through the years as

well as a slave cemetery.

Interestingly, after the War Between the States, plantation owners in Texas were in need of workers for their lands. Many, including the owner of The Cedar's, sent their managers to Europe in search of workers. Poland, Germany and the Austrian Empire were particularly singled out as prospective areas that might supply those workers. Poland was especially receptive because of the economic state of the country. Between 1870 and early 1900's, workers were brought over into this area from Poland, who share-cropped the land of 'The Cedar's', eventually in time acquiring their own property. A significant number of immigrants from the Ukraine of Russia also came into the area, invited by relatives who had immigrated earlier. Some may have also worked the plantation lands, though many bought their own parcels of land. 'The Cedar's' has passed through several owners, the present owners being the Butler Family.

News is that the first phase of the development of the property will comprise 350 homesites each on an acre/acre-and-a-half. I have heard that even now roads are being cut out and homesites being plotted. Needless-to-say our landscape will be changing and will have an impact on our community of Plantersville and our community of St. Mary. With the completion of Hwy 249, the entire area of Grimes County will be impacted and change is inevitable. Hwy 249 is now also in St. Joseph's backyard. Doesn't take an atom scientist to figure out what that means.

In our Easter Gospels that we have been hearing these 50 days, Christ has been assuring His disciples to 'not be afraid', 'do not be distressed or fearful'. These changes in the landscape coming will in no way affect the tenor of who we are as a community of faith. Our hallmark and our 'notoriety' in the Archdiocese are our eagerness to embrace everyone who comes to join our family. FM 1774 is a wide road leading to the open doors of a quaint church who enjoys standing shoulder-to-shoulder raising the roof in prayer and song. When Hwy 249 is complete to Hwy 105 and subdivisions pop up behind St. Joseph, it won't be long before what was once a little hidden will be in the spotlight and be as welcoming.

Though what's coming down the pike might seem dramatic and like a tsunami, actually in the 22 years I have been here, change has been constant and accepted with grace and joy. I personally live to greet and welcome new parishioners. I have been told by visitors how welcome they feel the moment they get out of their car in the parking lot. Those in the next car or walking to the church say 'hello' and they feel like friends entering the church. Our fellowship after Mass is being discussed and copied in other parishes. That spirit of 'welcome', the grace of greeting each other with affection, the eagerness of helping out, lending a hand won't change as we continue to grow and as the landscape begins to take on a different look. It'll be a challenge. But, 'ain't life challenging'! We're up to meet, accept and relish whatever life offers us.

Just to assure you we are being pro-active in all that's going on, I'm working to refine our master plan for both our communities of St. Mary and St. Joseph. Doing so will help us to be prepared for the changes that will be coming our way and continue to maintain our uniqueness as 'those cute country churches' of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston. Retire?! Too much to do!
